Adams County Homemaker Health Service is a not-for-profit corporation founded in 1968 by a group of community minded citizens. The office is located in Quincy, Illinois. The purpose for which the corporation was organized is to provide psychological, physical, and spiritual support to seniors or anyone in need of this service. Our goal is to provide either long or short term care to enable individuals to remain in their homes as opposed to institutionalized care.

Adams County Homemaker Health Service (ACHHS) offers in-home care services 24 hours a day, seven days a week, including holidays. The homemaker aides assist clients with bathing and grooming, light housekeeping, laundry, medication reminders, meal preparation, and transport clients to doctor appointments and the grocery store. The agency also has a companion service.

Under the direction of ACHL-IS, an Adult Day Service is available. This service provides the direct care and supervision of adults, in a community based setting for the purpose of providing personal attention and promoting physical, social and emotional well-being.

The staff of the Adult Day Service is made up of caring professionals and volunteers that include the program director, registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, and program aides. The staff assists clients with bathing, foot care, exercises, and medication management. There is also a licensed beautician who is on-hand once a week to wash and style their hair. The clients enjoy activities and games such as dominos, bingo, arts and crafts, community outings, and holiday celebrations.

The Adult Day Service will accept donations or other financial gratuities. This will enhance the wellbeing of all the clients and help purchase medical supplies, activities, etc. To offer a donation, you may contact Teri Peter or Emma Bruening.
